## UYSA Board Meeting November 19, 2020 at 7:00 pm

## **Study Session:**

<u>Club Pass/Team Performance - Zig Peacock</u>. Tabled until next board meeting per Zig's request

#### <u>U9 Standards League - Renata Lawson</u>

Renata Lawson -expressed concerns about the u9 standards league and the progression as we move into the u10-U11 standards league. Suggested we need more time to get membership and parents to buy into entire concept (she had received push back in her region). Main problem was getting parents to buy in- many do not want to referee per the new CCL requirement; they want to watch kids play. Board and clubs generally like the idea but they are seeing possible setbacks and opposition to the idea of moving forward.

<u>Eric Landon</u> – (commented on Renata's concerns) Mentioned that his intent has been to move forward into the older age groups, but realizes the concept will be foreign to parents and they'll need time to get used to it. Will follow up with Renata and determine ways to educate and poll parents on the idea.

#### RSL Tickets - Matt Rader

<u>Matt Rader-</u> Discussed the idea of UYSA purchasing an RSL ticket for every player. He said that it is something that will need to be discussed with the new owner of RSL but that we're working with this idea with an overall larger partnership with RSL. Believes that every player should have the chance to attend an RSL game every year. Board generally in favor of researching the idea further with RSL as partnership talks continue.

#### <u>League Alignment – 2 Step Drop – Scot Boyd/Cindy Baron</u>

<u>Bryan Attridge-</u> spoke regarding the organizational members that were nontraditional, meaning OM's that allow different teams and clubs to form within their organization. Current OMs such as NUU, South Cache Soccer, League 30 and NUCS. Discussion revolved around groups of like teams or clubs within these Oms being allowed to apply to become their own OM and maintain their alignment spots in our state league.

Eric Landon- Spoke This may affect policies; changes may need to be made.

<u>Renata Lawson-</u> If these non-traditionals prove that they came in under the umbrella of the MO and was functioning as a club before continuity that was moved away from the MO ownership. We may be able to consider working with them.

<u>Eric-</u>Most of these groups function with their own BOD. They have coaching and administration leadership, nonprofit stats-common unform, their own bank account for fee collection and 100 or more players. They have all the qualifying factors to become their own OM.

Brian Babcock - Suggests those that we think this affects let them voice their opinions regarding this topic.

Toby Yoshida – we should discuss more in private.

Staff tasked with talking with each OM that this would affect and get their feedback on the topic. Are they for or against it, are there other factors to consider before moving forward and drafting policy language for change.

<u>Blane Hale-</u> Asked if teams leaving a non traditional OM would be able to recruit teams from the umbrella org that they are leaving.

<u>Eric Landon-</u> (in response) Recruiting rules would apply. They would not be able to recruit from the umbrella org that they are leaving, but obviously no policy has been written, this is all just in discussion phase at this point.
